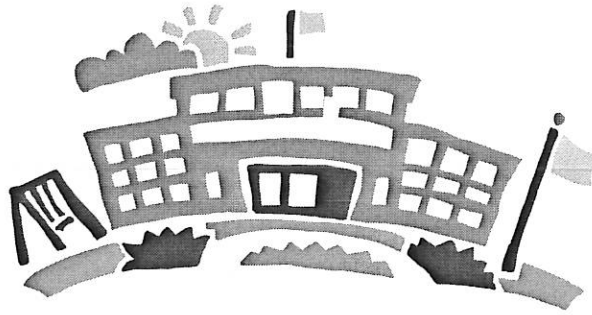
SUNSET JUNIOR HIGH REGISTRATION FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR WILL TAKE PLACE IN JULY 2023. A POSTCARD WILL BE MAILED OUT PRIOR TO REGISTRATION WITH DIRECTIONS ON WHERE TO FIND THE INFORMATION NECESSARY TO REGISTER YOUR STUDENT INFORMATION SUCH AS THE NECESSARY PAPERWORK, FEES, AND DUE DATES WILL BE AVAILABLE ON THE REGISTRATION TAB OF THE SUNSET JUNIOR HIGH WEBSITE. ONCE THE POSTCARDS HAVE BEEN SENT, REGISTRATION CAN BE DONE ONLINE AND MUST BE COMPLETED AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE BEFORE THE END OF JULY. THE COURSE REQUEST AND OTHER PAPERWORK YOU ARE COMPLETING NOW IS FOR ORIENTATION ONLY.

Immunization Requirements 7th Grade Entry 2023-2024

To attend 7th grade, a student *must have* written proof of receiving the following immunizations:

- ♦ **1 Tdap** (*Only Tdap vaccine given at age 10 years or older is acceptable for 7th grade school entry*)
- ♦ **2 Varicella (chickenpox)**
- ♦ **1 Meningococcal** (*Only Meningococcal Conjugate vaccine given at age 10 years or older is acceptable for 7th grade school entry*)
- ♦ **3 Hepatitis B**

This is in addition to the below immunizations that should have already been completed:

- ♦ **2 Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)**
- ♦ **4 Polio**
- ♦ **2 Hepatitis A**
- ♦ **5 DTaP/DT**

Recommended for 11-12 year olds, but not required for school entry in Utah:

- ♦ **HPV**
- ♦ **Influenza**
- ♦ **COVID-19**

Proof of immunity to disease(s) can be accepted in place of vaccination only if a document from a health care provider stating the student previously contracted the disease is presented to the school.

For children whose parents claim an exemption to immunization for medical, religious, or personal reasons, their legally responsible individual must complete an online immunization education module at immunize.utah.gov or in-person consultation at a local health department. A copy of the certificate must be presented to the school or child care official.

For a medical exemption from the required immunizations, a completed vaccination exemption form and a written notice signed by a licensed healthcare provider must be presented to the school.

Course Descriptions

Fine Arts

2301	Choir I (YR): Choral singing class combined with general music. Students explore musical concepts like note values, pitch, rhythm, music connections, and learning to perform. Evening performances required (fees required).
2204	Band I Brass (YR): Class for students wanting to play a trumpet, trombone, baritone, french horn and tuba. Students provide/rent their own instrument and plan to attend summer band camp. Evening performances required.
2205	Band I Woodwinds (YR): Class for students wanting to play a clarinet, flute, oboe, bassoon, or saxophone. Students provide/rent their own instrument and plan to attend summer band camp. Evening performances required.
2405	Orchestra I (YR): Continuation of the 6th grade Orchestra class. Beginners are welcome, but will need to catch up to the class. Students provide/rent their own instrument. Evening performances required.
2316	Music Exploration (SEM): A basic music class where students explore musical concepts.
2502	Theatre I (SEM): Students focus on creating, performing, responding, and connecting by learning basic theatre concepts and techniques. Preference is given to 8th and 9th graders.
2101	Art Found I (SEM): Beginning art class. Focus on Art Elements (fees required).
2102	IA Adv Found 2D Art (SEM): Prerequisite Art Found I. Building upon prior knowledge gained in Art Found I. Preference given to 8th and 9th graders (fees required).

Career & Technical Education

7403	FACS Exp Intg (SEM): Students learn interpersonal skills, child care skills, sewing skills, cooking basics, and interior design (fees required).
7810	Exploring Tech I (SEM): Students apply engineering principles through hands-on activities by constructing wood-based and 3D printed projects and manufacturing (fees required).
7743	Creative Coding (SEM): An introduction to computer programming (coding).
7775	Intro to Python I (SEM): Prerequisite Creative Coding. Introduction to the Python programming language.

Other Electives

3110	Spanish I (YR): World Language class covering the basics of the Spanish language. Preference given to 8th and 9th graders.
3410	German I (YR): World Language class covering the basics of the German language. Preference given to 8th and 9th graders.
1040	Ind Lifetime Activities-Yoga (SEM): Students work with the body through postures, breathing, and relaxation to unite their physical, mental, and spiritual self.
4335	Creative Writing (SEM): Students develop a variety of approaches to writing prose, poetry, and short stories. Preference given to 8th and 9th graders.
4531	Civics (SEM): Focus on the principles, functions, and organization of government; the origins of American Political System; the roles, rights, and responsibilities of United States citizens.

Audition/Application Only (DO NOT LIST ON COURSE REQUEST)

Yearbook I (YR): Online application required (https://tinyurl.com/SunsetJHYearbook). Students plan and create the school yearbook. A few 7th grade students will be selected as interns for Yearbook.
Band Percussion (YR): Audition required. Learn basic fundamentals of rhythm, pitch, and ensemble performance, while playing multiple percussion instruments. Must have at least 1 year of piano or ensemble experience. Students provide/rent their own instrument. Evening performances required.
Musical Theatre (SEM): Audition required. Students engage in a complete theatrical experience by participating in a production. Rehearsals and evening performances required.
